• Evaluate

Ask team members to evaluate the ministry, then make appropriate improvements.

Summerfield First Baptist Church Projects 2023

- **Prayer Walk.** Participants will prayer walk Summerfield Road from the Town Hall to the Fire Station, making stops along the way for group prayer. We will be assisted by the Guilford County Sheriff's Office to ensure everyone's safety. All ages are encouraged to participate. All ages are welcome.
- Countryside Village Assisted Living. Participants in this project will do landscaping, yard word, power washing and other outdoor projects.
 Who: All ages welcome to participate; children under 13 require adult supervision (Project limited to 15 participants per night)
- **Teacher Appreciation Lunch.** Participants in this project will help prepare gift bags and deliver lunch to area schools as an appreciation to teachers & school administration. All ages welcome to participate.
- Midori Express Japanese Restaurant. Midori is across the street from the Greensboro abortion clinic and allows "Love Life" participants to hold prayer walks on their property. Participants of this project will do landscaping and yard work to beautify the grounds of the restaurant. Participants are encouraged to eat dinner at the restaurant during the project time to support and bless this business.
 Who: All ages are welcome to participate; children under 13 require adult supervision (No limit)
- Fire Department and Family Appreciation Celebration. To show our appreciation of our local fire department personnel we will have an appreciation dinner and celebration for them and their families. Weather permitting, this will be an outside event held on our church multipurpose field. Participants of this project will help with set up, serving food, help with the children's activities and clean up after the event is over. All ages are welcome to participate (Project limited to 30 participants)
- Meals on Wheels & FBCS Shut-In Care Bags. We will prepare care bags which will be delivered to our FBCS shut-ins as well as Meals on Wheels recipients in our community.
- **Tabatha's Ministry House.** Tabitha Ministry is a healing center for ladies who have been abandoned, rejected, or abused physically and or emotionally. Tabitha's provides a one-year shelter to tear down their walls of fear and hopelessness and introduce them to the Love of Christ. This is an outdoor project. Participants of this project will help with power washing, painting, removing fence posts, rebuilding fire pit, fixing wooden swing and rocking chairs. All ages welcome to participate; children under 13 require adult supervision (Project limited to 15 participants per night)
- **Founders Day**. Participants in this project will serve on a 2-hour rotation, greeting people and distributing church promotional items, at our booths at the Summerfield Founders Day.
- **Countryside Assisted Living Resident Birthday Party.** Participants will host a large birthday party for all residents and staff of Countryside Assisted Living Center.

- <u>Community Housing Solutions</u> Saturday, April 27 and Saturday, November 2, 8:30am-3:30pm: This one-day event is focused on home repairs and neighborhood revitalization in the assigned neighborhood of High Point (Greensboro locations too on various dates). Group participants must be 14 and older. CHS provides gloves, safety gear and tools, but bringing additional tools is always appreciated. Would you like to serve on a team? There is on-site training. We love this organization!
- <u>West End Ministries</u> Serve in the Thrift Stores to sort and organize. Who can serve? Students through adults.
- <u>West End Ministries</u> HPU donates goods and West End needs help with pick ups and organizing goods to be placed in the Thrift Stores and begin setting up for their Yard Sale. Students through adults. (May)

- <u>Show love to nurses</u> –Grab church friends and love on nurses! We will gather to put together goody bags to deliver, or call the office or hospital to find out what would work for their situation if you want to bless another office not listed below, plan a meal for the ED.
